

Hello Pastor David Jahnke,

First of all, I hope that you and your family are in very good health. My name is Isayana Calderón, I am 17 years old and I am studying Civil Engineering. My [true] mom, Mirna, [the Director of Inhijambia School], told me to write you this letter and tell you about my life, so that you can get to know me a little. My mom and my godfather, Jerry, play a very important role in the progress of my life. My godfather, Jerry, always sends me letters and gives me encouragement to move forward. My mom is always there for me.

I want to tell you that I am very happy, because you are also my god [parents]. I hope you find my letters interesting, like my godfather Jerry. I'm going to tell you a little about my life in the past and what it is like today.

My parents separated due to personal problems. My mother abandoned me when I was a very little girl [and] my father is in the US. I live with my paternal grandparents and other relatives. My parents' absence is a difficult and painful problem for me, but thanks to God and Inhijambia, I have been overcoming the difficulties that arise.

When I was 9 years old, I liked to be in the streets of the eastern market, playing with many children. I also played on the little machines that are games of chance. I came home very late at night and no one told me anything because no one cared. And at such a young age, I didn't know that it was dangerous, and that I was causing a problem for myself.

When I was 11 years old, thank God I met Inhijambia. There I have learned many things, but the most important thing is that I learned to make the right decisions, to feel loved and protected, I became an empowered girl who sets goals for her life.

Last year I graduated, and this year ,2023, I chose to study Civil Engineering. The truth is that it has beer one of the best decisions of my life. Civil engineering is about designing, building and maintaining infrastructures. I love my career and I am passionate about it. I am close to finishing the first year, in total there are 5 years.

Thank you very much because you will help me in my studies. I promise that I will always give my best effort to move forward, to achieve each proposed goal. I will show them that I will be a successful and human Engineer, but above all I will support those who need me. I hope you can visit us soon and we can talk in person. We are reporting a \$72,185 deficit through August. Contributing to this shortfall are unexpected overages in building maintenance and utilities (electricity) as well as lower offerings than projected. Please prayerfully consider increasing (or catching up) your offerings to help mitigate this shortfall. You will be receiving letters in the mail soon. We also need you to try and increase your giving in 2024 in order that we might keep reaching Gen Y and Z who are moving away from the Christian Faith, according to national surveys for years.
